Property Corner

This year has seen a number of projects big and small.

TiKouka upgrade

Our Ti Kouka block upgrade project is currently being finalised and we are hopeful for works to begin in the Christmas holidays. Key upgrades include a refurbished toilet facility block, updated breakout spaces, heating and acoustic refurbishments.

The Balcony outside of Manuka is now complete with an industrial floor carpet to allow additional teaching space and shelter from the Nor West wind, and shade in the summer months. Special thanks to FoWMS for funding the carpet costs in this area.

Shade sails

With summer on the horizon, additional shade sails will be erected supplementing current spaces for all akonga to enjoy. Thanks again to FoWMS for supporting the cost of the sails.

An extension to our perimeter fence on the South side of our Kowhai block will allow for additional quiet space for akonga and as well as an outdoor area for our junior school during the summer months.

Front court upgrades have seen new basketball/netball hoops installed (to be completed ready for term 4). These hoops are relocatable with the insert of a new underground sleeve, allowing for the longer term planned larger court development. Installation thanks to the generosity of Dan Cunningham Builders, with the funding of the hoops from our FoWMS Fete fundraising efforts.

Pool upgrade

An updated pool filtration system complements the heat pump upgrades of last year, and ensures the longer term viability and compliance of this wonderful school asset. To complete the upgrade works, a full resurface paint and seal will be completed in the coming years.

Sports ground maintenance

Special thanks to McClenaghan Contracting and Freeman Irrigation for their generous support of the school grounds works and also to FoWMS who provide volunteer hours as well as funding for various projects.

Bike container and mural

The container is now in place and panels and the door added. All ready to store the 31 bikes being delivered over the holidays. Kathryn Meyers has finished painting the mural and put on two coats of anti graffiti varnish. Kathryn wished to thanks to Chris Fifield for the use of his scaffolding and sourcing the paneling, John Blondell for the use of his shed and tools, Shona and her team from Mitre Ten Mega Hornby and Valspar paint for their generous donation of their product. And lastly all the students and parent helpers who gave up their time to help.

School Pool

Great news - we have been able to work through a number of projects on the pool throughout 2022 and things are looking positive to be open after Show Weekend as normal.

As well as new shade protection - the pool has had a new filter system installed which has been a major upgrade including a new pump shed and roof replacement. The new system will ensure water is circulated fast and efficiently and handle some of the 'non-water' items sometimes found in the pool a little easier. However the cloudy water we have seen in recent summers is a result of fresh sunscreen in the water and not a filter issue so we would appreciate

families ensuring they apply sunblock at home and wait at least 20min before they enter the water to ensure we keep the pool crystal clear.

The work is on schedule to be completed for this coming season, however an impending complete resurface and paint job is scheduled for after this summer.

Fete

The Board were delighted to hear the Friends of West Melton School (FoWMS) has planning underway for the 2023 Fete. To date the Fete's have raised over \$90,000 for the school and this has been used to add playspaces, outdoor learning areas, shade sails, basketball hoops, as well as tackling some smaller projects that aren't covered by standard Ministry of Education Ops Budgets.
